

On June 23, 2017 the Church celebrates the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. At Mt. Grace Convent the Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters celebrate it with special devotion. The reason is that the Sisters have come to know that the Heart of the Redeemer, as noted

in their community Constitutions, is "the symbol of his intimate union with the Father and his perfect surrender to the Father's saving will." The Sisters' strong community devotion to the Sacred Heart came, of course, from St. Arnold Janssen, the founder of the community of Adoration Sisters. One brief, but memorable, prayer St. Arnold left all three missionary congregations which he founded is: "May the Heart of Jesus live in the hearts of all." The starting point, however, is with ourselves.


For the Heart of Jesus to live in us means that "we should accept the frame of mind, love, sacrifice, and zeal of Jesus and from this devote ourselves to the service of the Holy Triune God and burn with zeal for God and souls"

(Fr. Fischer, SVD, 1932). To be able to accept that challenge and then to live it means that we must come to know Jesus well. The main source for such personal knowledge of Jesus, symbolized by his Heart, is found in the Gospels—a living and loving gift to those who

follow Jesus. From the pages of Sacred Scripture we can begin to understand who Jesus really is, what he was sent by the Father to accomplish, and how we can identify our lives with his in terms of a loving heart.

Often the life of Jesus and his message, as presented in the New Testament, seem to have become too familiar. The result is that we have, as they say, the feeling that we have "heard it all before." The challenge offered us is not only to read the Scriptures, but to take the time to pause and ponder them. Such personal, prayerful reflection will help us to internalize the sacred texts and, in time, we will come to actually apply them in our daily lives. Jesus, who is love, will teach us to love God and others more. Jesus, who is obedient, will teach us to respond to the Lord with ever greater fidelity. Jesus, who gave his life for others, will teach us to reach out from our very hearts and tend to the needs of others with greater care and devotion.

The Sacred Heart is an engaging symbol. The biblical texts about Jesus remain a challenge. The challenge is to let them transform our hearts!


